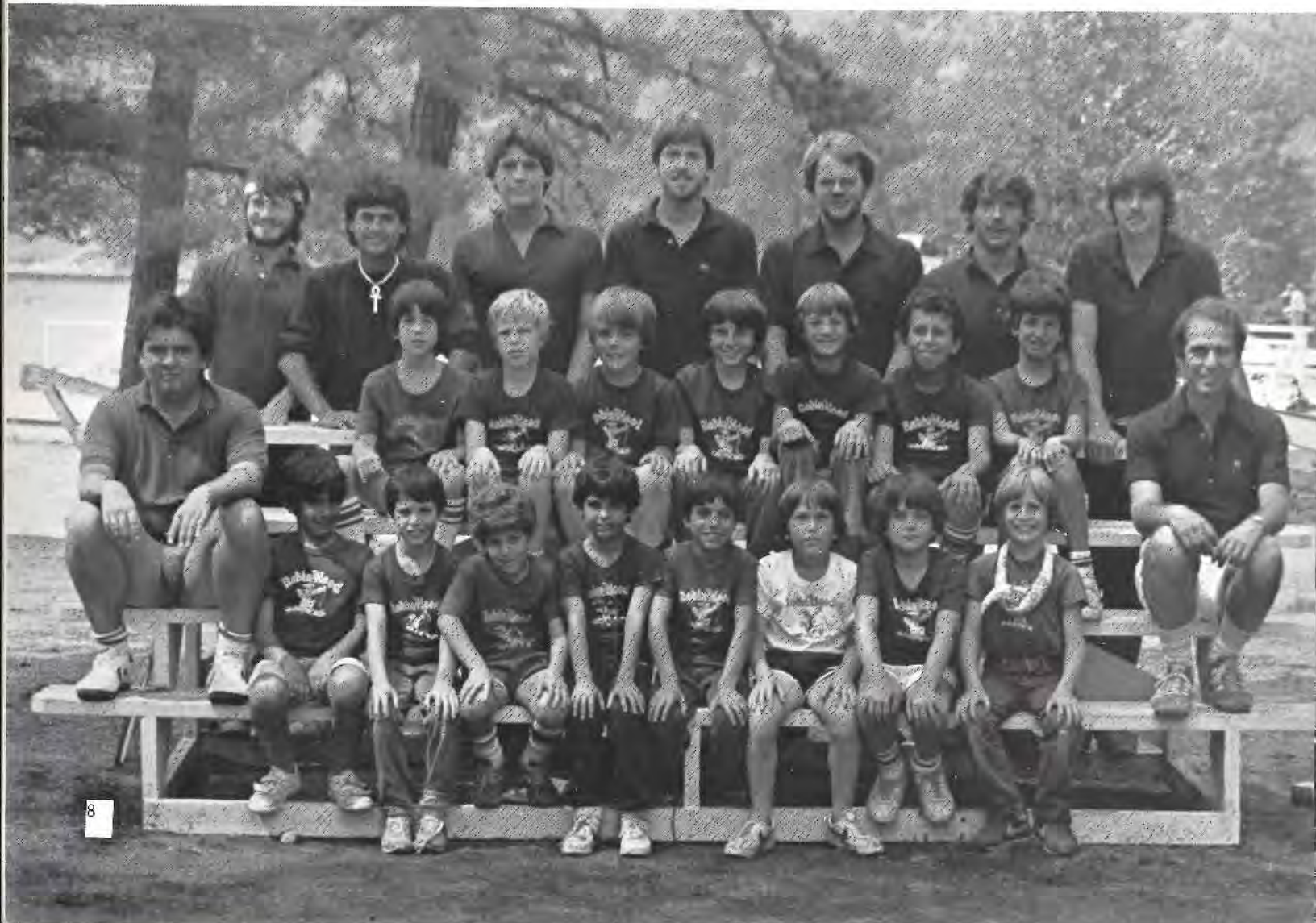
On June 26, 1982, the day of infamy began -- one of the greatest invasions of TPJs ever to hit the Realm. Here are some of the great moments of that invasion.

 lost his touch.

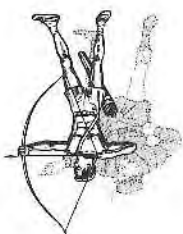
The Lancer group had some excellent

Aside from the Big Show, Sherwood Forest Playhouse was extremely potent the entire summer with

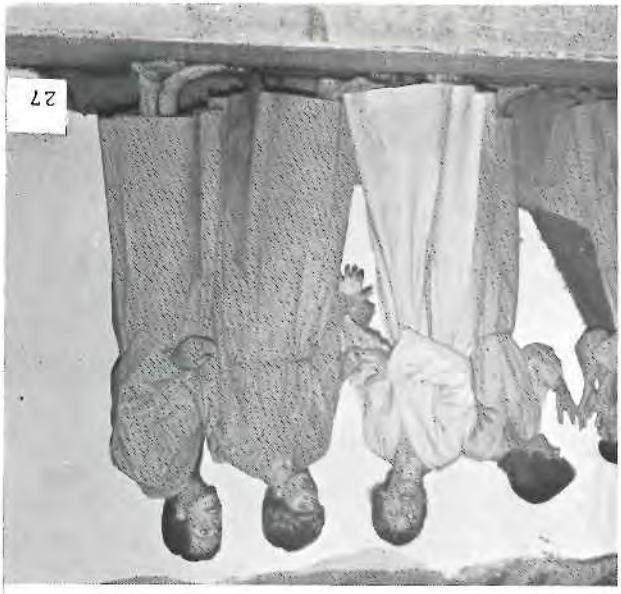

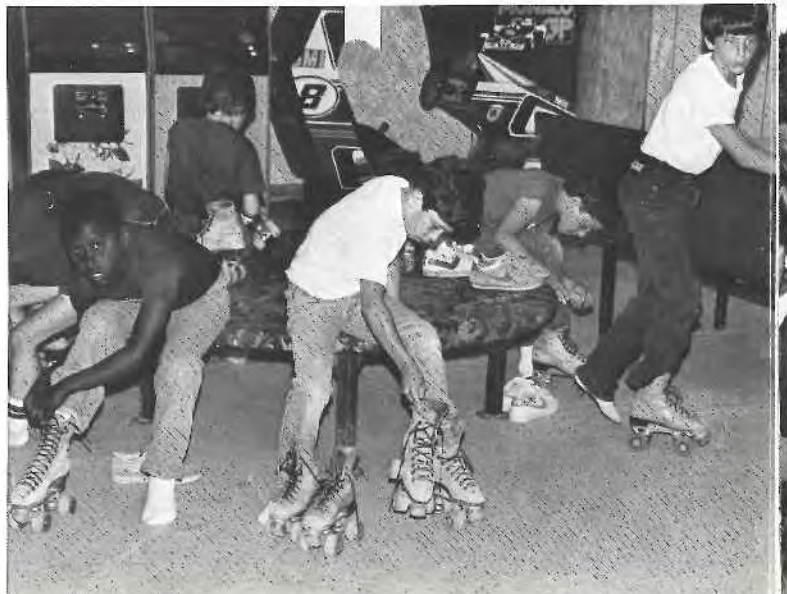

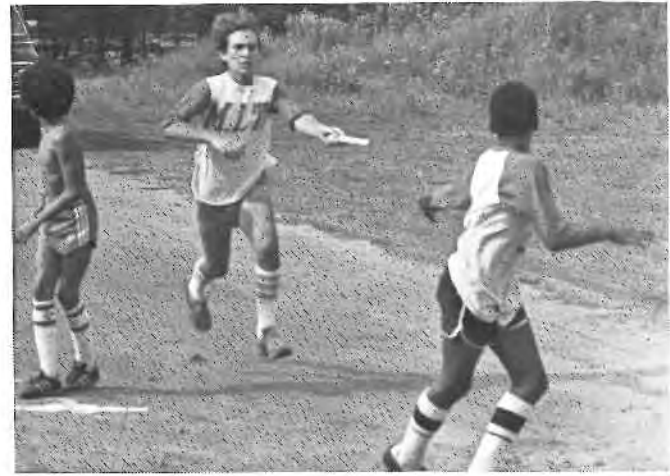

### 11 & Under Softball

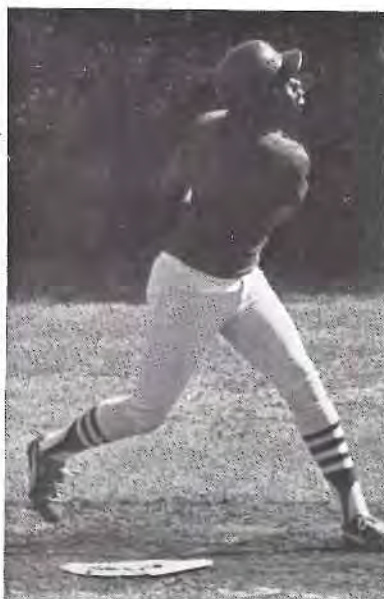

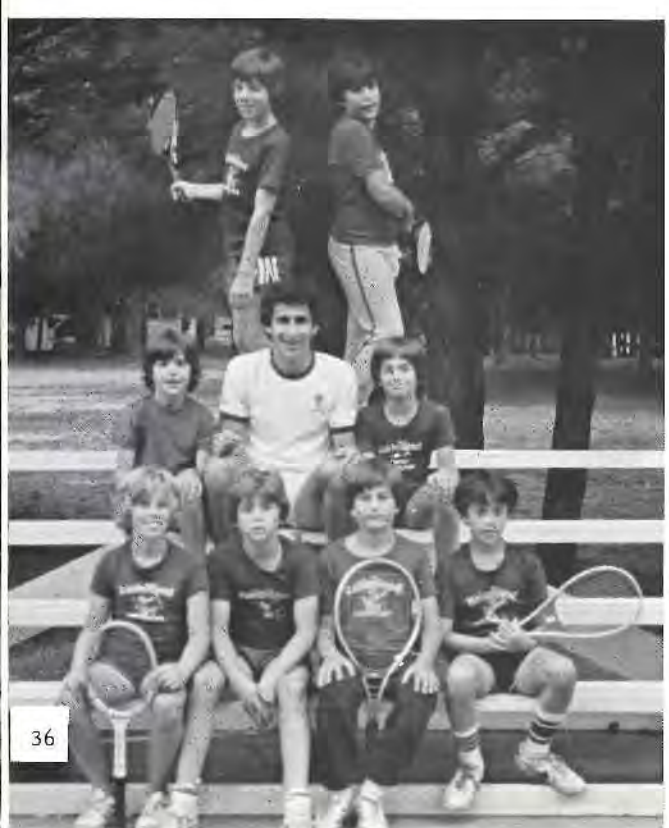

# SWIMMING

It all started with a great deal of scraping, painting, and grunting. Then we began the moving of the docks into the water. Once they were aligned, the annual renaissance of the Robin Hood waterfront was complete. It was time for the campers to arrive.

The first order of business was the 16-lap test and stroke analysis. This was done to ensure the campers' safety, and to place them in Red Cross swim classes. The campers were then timed in free-style, backstroke, and breaststroke. The times were used to help select entries for the swim meets in which the camp participated. Once the formalities were out of the way, instruction began on strokes, competitive swimming, and waterpolo.

There was a great deal of instruction given from the TPJs on up through the Lancers. The TPJs worked on beginners, advanced beginners, and intermediates. These courses were geared to teaching and refining the crawl stroke, elementary breaststroke, side-stroke, and breaststroke. The campers were instructed on arm motion, kick, and coordination. The Squires and Archers worked on the same courses, with the stronger campers working on their swimmers. This course is concerned with the strokes mentioned previously, plus work on the backstroke. Many of the senior campers worked on Basic Rescue and Water Safety and Advanced Swimmers. The former is a self-help course designed to promote personal safety around and on the water. Advanced Swimmers deals with perfecting all the strokes, while learning trudgen crawl and inverted breaststroke. The highest course offered was Advanced Lifesaving. This was given to any Forester or Saxon who was 15 years of age and able to withstand the rigorous training required to pass. The following campers earned Red Cross certificates:
