LACROSSE

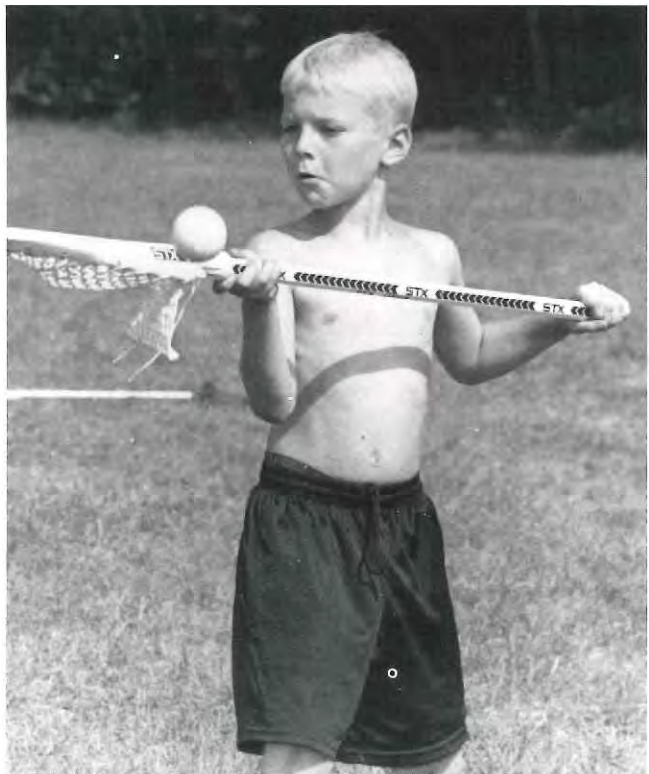

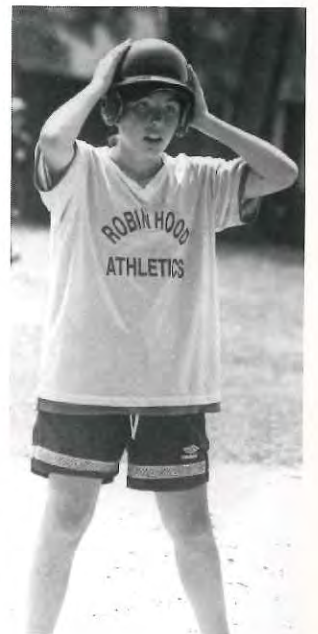
There is so much more to write about our baseball/ softball season. These have been just a few highlights of an exceptional summer on our Fields of DREAMS!

RIFLERY

The summer of '95 again produced a very high quality of fine shooters at the Sherwood Forest Riflery Range. By the end of the season, 51,000 rounds had been fired and a large section of the camp came out to the range to shoot. Over 7,200 targets were submitted for scoring and 91 boys and 22 girls had earned shooting awards, from Pro-Marksman through Distinguished Expert. Among these, 360 levels of awards were earned with 5 Experts by Boys and 1 Expert by a Girl.

Of 22 PJ/Squires, all came to riflery to learn new shooting skills and some to improve on past abilities, where 19 earned 82 different levels of awards. The following 7 boys earned from Pro-Marksman through Bar 1 (prone): Simon Carbonell, Peter Jackson, Ben Jelin, Ethan Lieberman, Zachary Mann, Duncan Mendelsohn, and Craig Rudikoff, with Emre Kennedy to Bar 3 (sitting) and Geoffrey Cox to Bar 4 (sitting). The Most Improved learner in the group was Tom Hamilton (age 9) earning 6 Light Rifle awards of Marksman and Sharpshooter in Prone, Standing and Three Position. To complete his awards, Tom also earned Pro-Marksman through Expert 50 feet four position. Tom was also awarded the Most Improved in Junior Camp. The high shooter in the group was again Tom with a 94 prone, 47 sitting and 47 standing, and also earned the Best in Junior Camp award.

22 Archers also came to riflery with 18 earning 60 different levels of awards. The higher levels of earning were Nick Morley to Bar 1 (prone), Jesse Brush to Bar 3 (sitting), Michael Kanon Pro-Marksman through Bar 4 (sitting), Alex Capriles to Bar 6 (kneeling) and Marco Delfino, Aaron Samet and Michael Squires through Bar 7 (kneeling). The high shooter of the group was Marco Delfino with a 98 and 190. Marco was also awarded the Best in Junior Camp.

All 31 Yeomen came to riflery with 23 earning 77 different levels of awards. The higher levels of earning were by Juan Carbonell and Bud Nolan through Bar 1 (prone), Mike Firestone, Hale Season, Michael Thalhimer and Adam Uth through Bar 2 (sitting), Myles Grosovsky and Marc Siegel through Bar 4 (sitting) and Raffi Fuchs-Simon, Clayton Harley and Thomas Lee through Bar 5 (kneeling). The two highest levels earned were by Sam Allison and Tom Gilmore with Bar 7 (kneeling) and Bar 8 (standing). The high shooter of the group was Sam Allison with a 186.

31 Lancers also came to riflery with 17 earning 52 different levels of awards. Starting the higher levels of earnings we have Ben Farrer, Matt Rando-Chanon, Dan Russell, Jay Ryan and David Speranza all shooting through Bar 1 (prone). Then both Alex and Chris Kenyon earned through Bar 2 (sitting), with Doug McCormick earning to Bar 4 (sitting). For the next higher levels earned, we have Eric Batscha, Eduardo Capriles, Doug Cress and Danny Wilansky shooting through Bar 6 (kneeling). The highest level obtained was by Jay Klein earning Bar 9 (standing). The two highest shooters were Jay Klein with a 90 and Doug Cress with a 187.

23 Friars had some individuals with a stronger desire when time was available to enjoy shooting for fun while learning harder skill levels with 4 earning 13 different levels of awards. Garrett Dale earned Sharpshooter with Javier Restrepo earning Pro-Marksman through Bar 1 (prone). The two highest learners were Jordan Klein earning Bar 7 (kneeling) combined with earning Light Rifle Marksman and Sharpshooter (prone) and Marksman (3 position) along with Scott Gordon finishing with Bar 7 (kneeling) and Bar 8 & 9 (standing). The high shooter of the group was Jordan Klein with a 96.

26 Foresters also enjoyed shooting when time was available, showing they all still had the super skills of fine shooters, with 8 earning 15 different levels of awards. The high shooters were Luis Guerra earning MM 1st and Sharpshooter; Michael Weiner Pro-Marksman through Bar 1 (prone); and Michael Ziman earning Sharpshooter and Bar 1 (prone). The highest awards earned were by Andrew Gralnek with Bar 2 & 3 (sitting). The highest shooter was Josh Stein-Sapir with a perfect 50.

Then came 9 Saxons. When time was available, they came to enjoy some shooting using their past learned skills where 2 earned 14 different levels of awards. Two of the finest Saxons came to finish their shooting demonstrations; first, Toby Stern finished his shooting by earning a Light Rifle Expert in Prone and Three Positions followed by an Expert I in J.O.S.P. Toby, for his drive to succeed and his three Expert awards, was awarded one of two of the Most Improved in Senior Camp for 1995. The second Most Improved in Senior Camp went to an individual earning the highest level of Marksmanship that can be earned at Robin Hood, The Distinguished Expert, to James Joseph Ackell. JJ Ackell and Toby Stern also developed a level of perfect scores that few have obtained. Toby shot three 50's, followed by JJ developing the

epitome for others to follow with five 50's and seven 100's. Also, with JJ's fine shooting abilities on record and the teaching he gave many young shooters for a solid foundation in the future events for themselves, was also awarded the Best in Senior Camp for 1995.

Starting with the girls camp for 1995, 5 Jesters came to riflery and learned many new shooting and safety skills with a lot of fun. No major awards were earned but each time they arrived at the range, they were full of smiles, having a lot of fun while learning this new activity.

25 Bows came with 10 earning 25 awards. Cora Crowley, Emma Firestone, Carly Neidorf and Dara Wilansky earned up to Marksman. Julie Baumgardner, Alice Dodds, Alissa Rothchild and Mara Weinstein earned as far as Marksman 1st. The 2 highest awards earned go to Gretchen Gough who earned Pro-Marksman through Sharpshooter and shooting a high score of 46 in prone. Finishing, Rachel Farrer earned Sharpshooter through Bar 7 (kneeling) and shooting a high score of 46 in both (sitting & kneeling). Rachel also received the Most Improved and The Best in Camp awards for Junior Girls 1995.

11 Arrows came to riflery. The two most improved shooters were Julia Holczer earning Pro-Marksman and Julie Ritz earning Marksman. The high shooter was Fallyn Smith with an 89 in (sitting).

26 Shires also came to riflery with 9 earning 19 different levels of awards. The higher levels of shooting were by Stephanie Guerrerri, Margot Stern and Becca Strauss earning through Bar 1 (prone), then followed by Stephanie Whitehorn earning Bar 2 (sitting). The highest award was earned by Jessica Freidin shooting Bar 5 (kneeling) and was also the highest shooter of the group with 96 and 191. Jessica Freidin also was awarded the Best in Camp for Senior Girls.

To finish the higher skill levels obtained by the girls, 18 Scribes came to riflery when time was available where Lissy Alvaran earned Pro-Marksman through Sharpshooter. Finishing the summer, Jennifer Kops shot a high score of 98 for the group and also earned her 50 foot Expert rating. She also received the camp award of Most Improved for Senior Girls.

As I began to write this article, I came up to the tennis courts before the last day of camp began. Birds were chirping, crickets humming, Gene Doe passed a few times on his faithful tractor, but the courts were empty/still. It was then that I missed the life, the energy, the enthusiasm, the consistency and lack thereof and the learning that took place at tennis this summer. So, I begin this article by thanking you, our students. You who put up with shadow drills and laps and suicides and hardest drills in the world. You whose everlasting points sometimes lasted days. You who now know top edge from bottom edge, semi-western from continental. And you and you and you who will always remember the number one rule of tennis.

After a few days on the courts, we graded and grouped, essentially getting an idea of what your tennis levels were, and then we moved into Specialty, and oh how we moved!

Part one: Lap with follow the leader, the shadow drill, sit and sweat, stretch. Mini tennis championships of the world (15 minutes) and then into forehands. Two groundies, approach, two volleys. * explain: this will be done at the end of the session, to view your



progress, or lack thereof. Volleys. Things to remember: continental grip, early contact, short backswing, hitting down, bottom edge, come forward to ball. Spread 'em out. Feed just forehands, then we'll talk a bit. Then we'll target. We're rotating. Now we can't forget two balls forward or backhands for that matter. Three balls forward. Add overhands (sideways, still, racket back early, reach up, snap through). Then repeat first drill. Collapse. (pros, take a week off) (ah, there's more) Part three: Run, timed hexagons, stretch. Two ball mini tennis. Ten minute review of volleys as a group. Into the two up two up championships of the world. Breathe. Serving and returning. Let's begin with returning. (Sight, moving forward, short backswing, early contact, chipping or driving?). Okay, catch these balls that are served to you, then throw them over, catch 'em in front, good... Now add your rackets. (Johnny, will you go get that ball that just hit Steve Barndt in the head?) (Thank you). Return plus two groundies. Into serving (continental, feet, lift and follow, down together up together, hit then step, pray, extend, pray, pronate, say hallelujah and hit up into the ball). "Why does a ball go long on a serve?" "Why does a ball go in the net on a serve?" Serving, serving, serving. Half serving, half returning. The knock blocking championships of the universe. 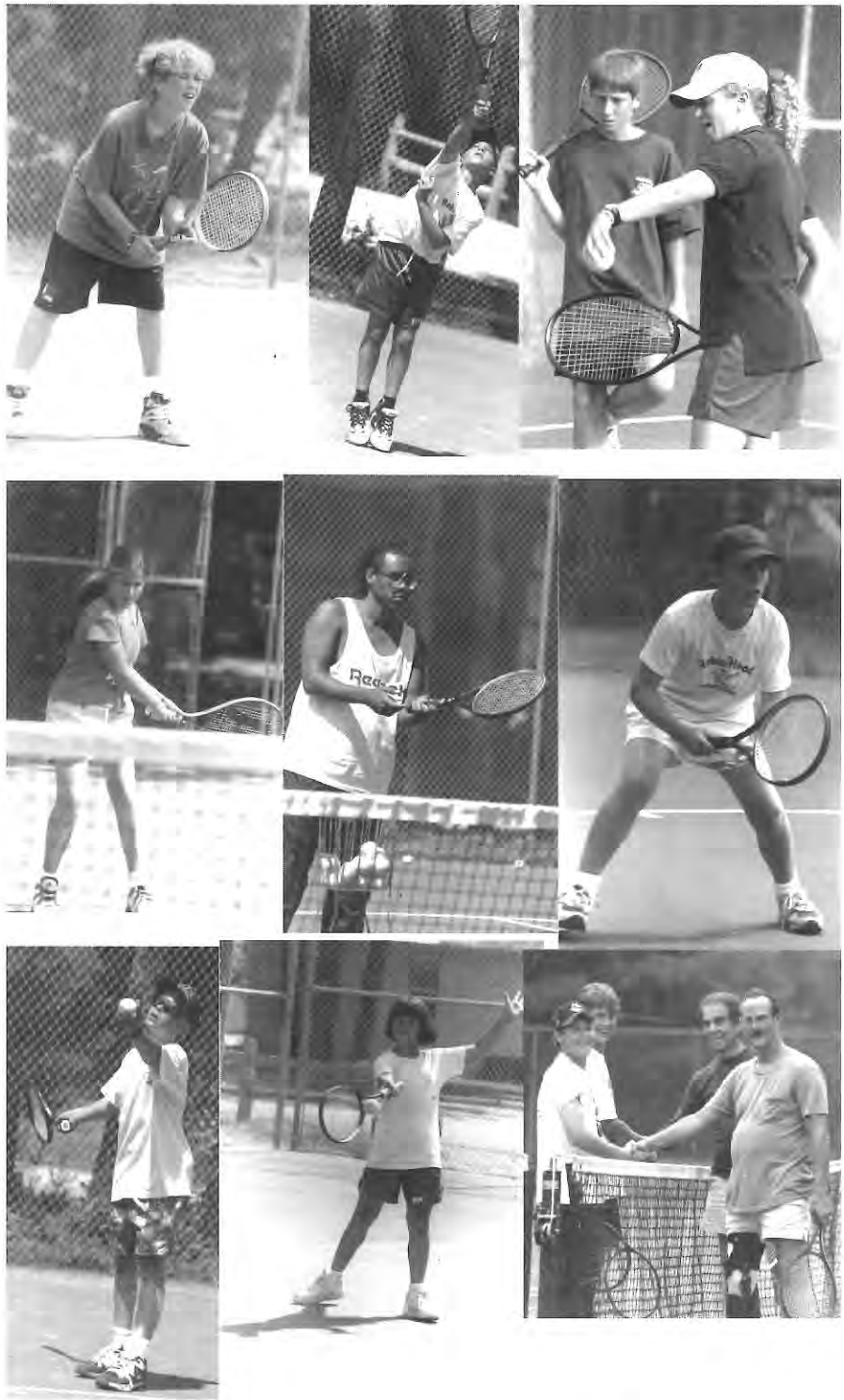

Tennis was a hot place to be this summer, but most of you came here to play and to learn new techniques and strategies. I hope you had fun and learned loads because I certainly did.

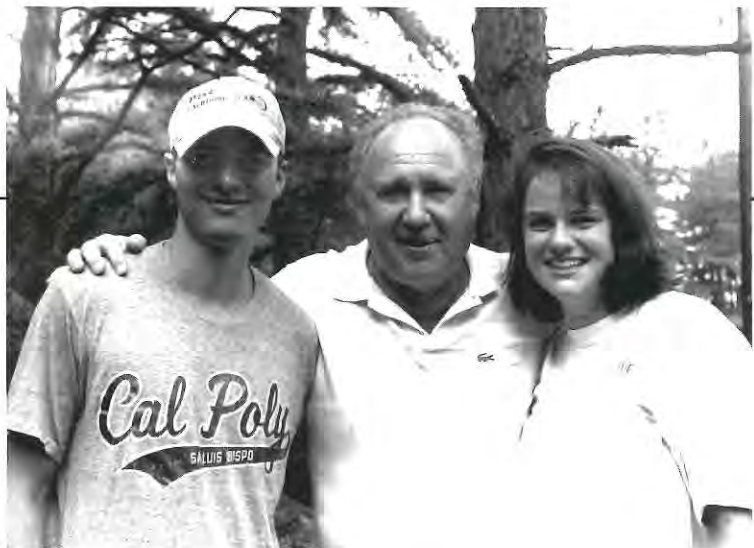

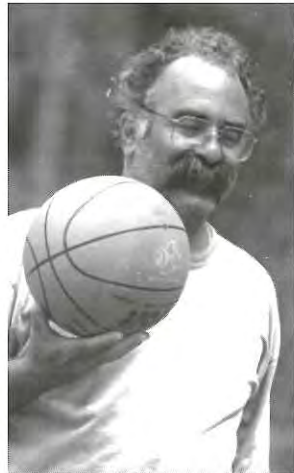
