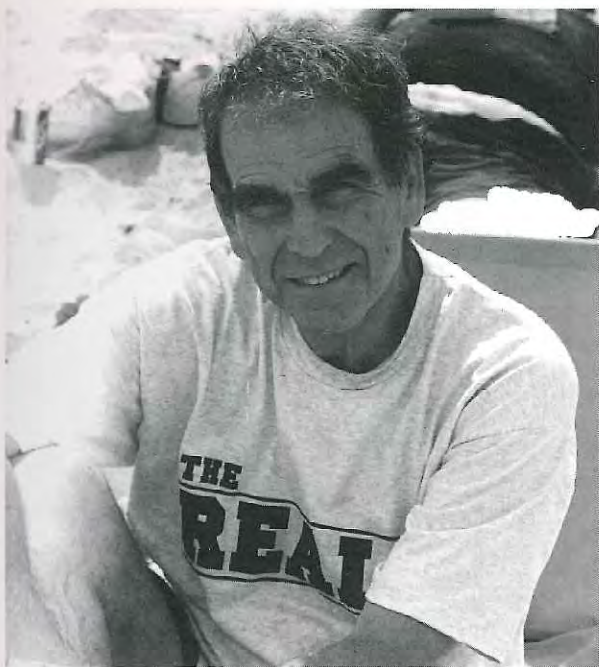

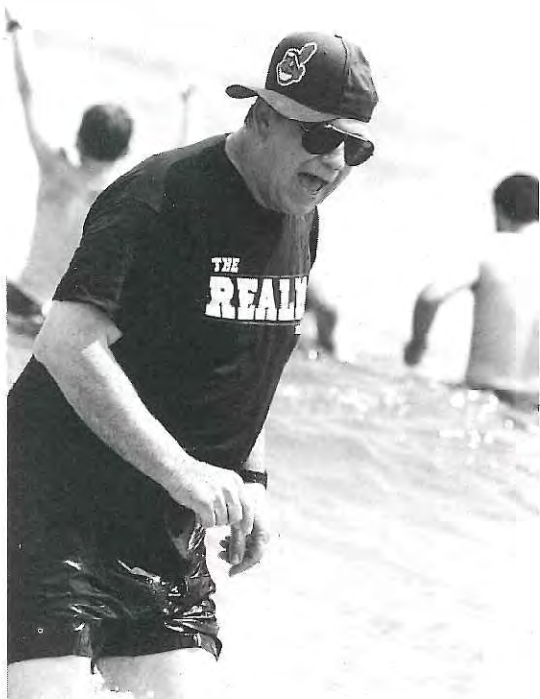

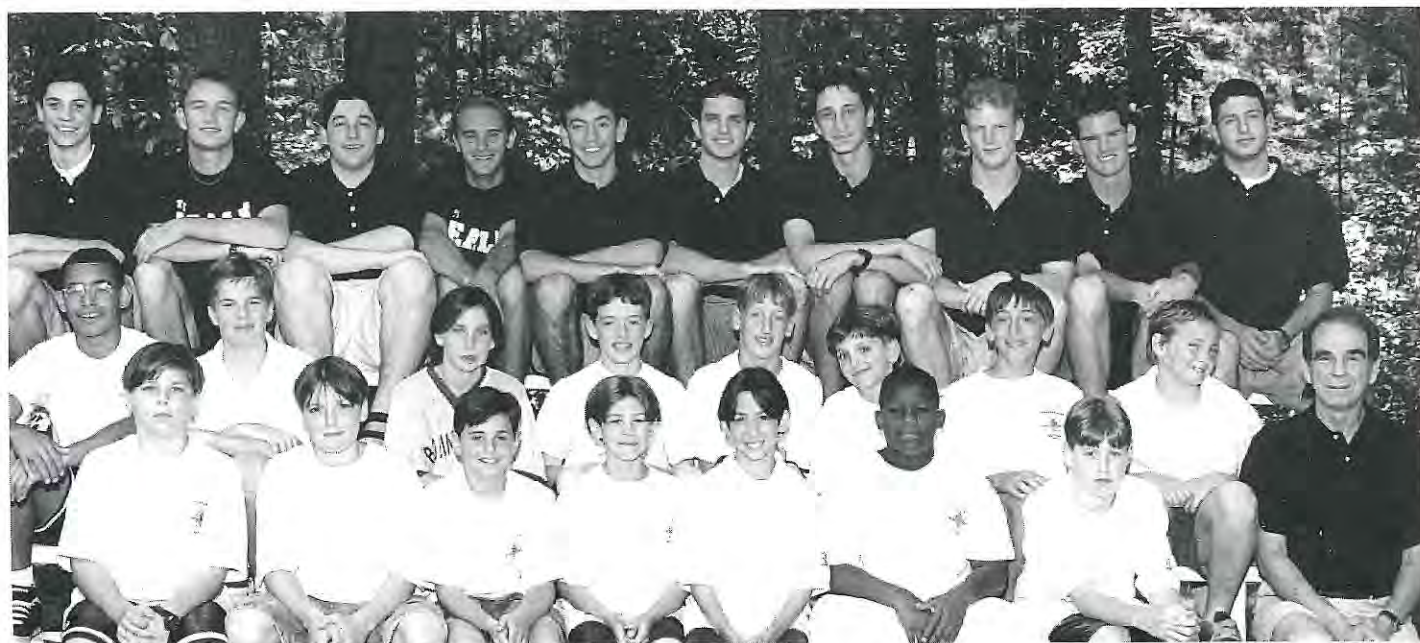

Steve Michelle.....

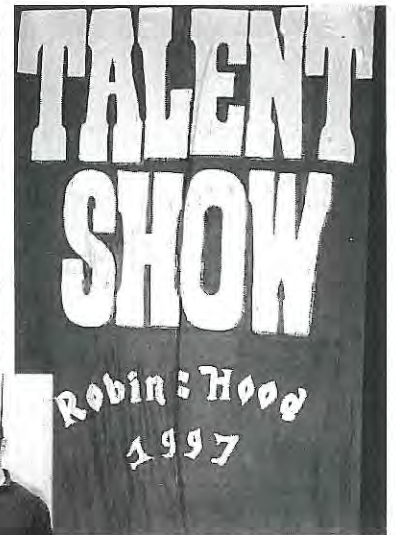

Against Cody, Robin Hood had no problem, defeating them 27-18. Olivier Busquet finished with 9 points, and shooting guard Matt Killian had 8. Next, the Hooders easily beat Camp Birchmont (whom we had already

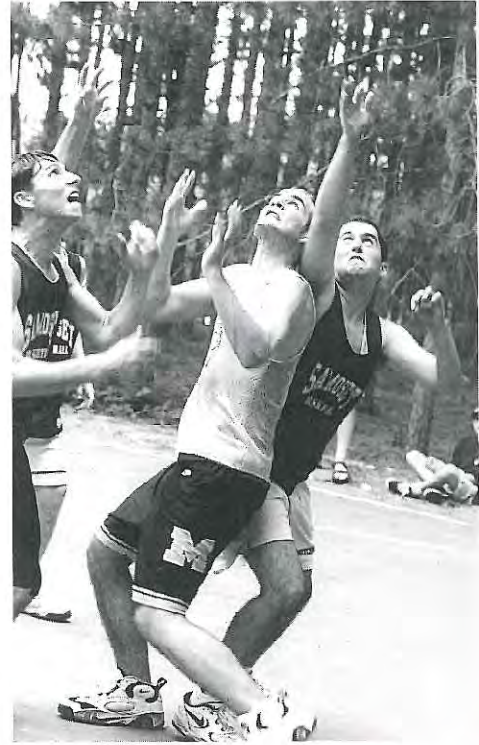
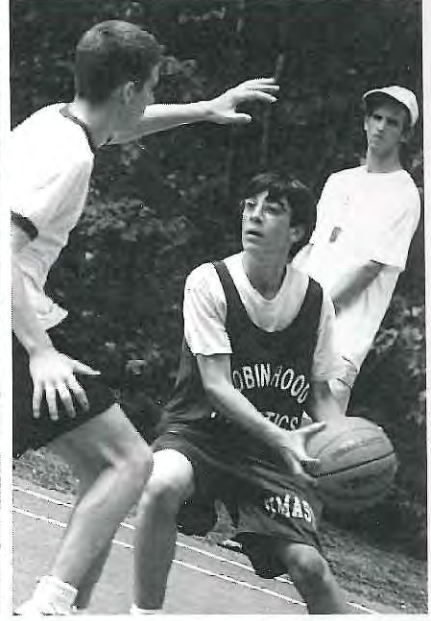
defeated at the Robin Hood tournament) 20-17, with the remarkable defense of Drew Cox, whose play sparked the rest of the team throughout the tournament. Finally, the

15's played the Winaukee "B" team. Led by Brandon Routman and strong play by Reess Kennedy, Robin Hood won easily, 16-6 — securing the first seed in the afternoon's semifinals.

In the semi's, Robin Hood was matched up against Winaukee Blue, who had defeated us 59-58 at



our own tournament. Fired up and seeking revenge, the Hooders controlled the game from the opening tip. Similar to last year, Robin Hood's press stifled Winaukee in the first few minutes, leading to easy baskets by Garrett Dale and Olivier Busquet, and an early Robin Hood lead. In the second half, however, Winaukee made a strong run, slowly slicing into the Hooder's lead. Jeff Baumgardner's strong play down low, coupled with Olivier Busquet's outside shooting, sealed a 38-37 Robin Hood victory. Busquet finished with an outstanding 22 points and Garrett Dale had 7 points. Finally, Robin Hood played an intimidating, strong and athletic team from Camp Tecumseh in a game for the trophy. Again, Robin Hood's incredible man-to-man press flustered the Tecumseh players, giving Robin Hood a 12-6 lead after the first quarter. In the second quarter, Tecumseh closed the Hooder's lead down to one point, but a steal and a lay-up by Garrett Dale, and a three pointer by Matt Killian, left Robin Hood up 19-13 at the half. In the second half, Robin Hood continued to frustrate the Tecumseh players with excellent defense, causing three of their key players to get into foul trouble. Playmaker Olivier Busquet capitalized on this opportunity by penetrating and scoring on Tecumseh's physical defense — carrying his team to a sweet 32-26 victory; winning the Lakes Region tournament for the first time in Robin Hood history!! Outstanding job!!

Boys 11 & Under - In the Tecumseh tournament, two great team performances gave us victories over Winaukee (2-1) and Tecumseh B (3-0). This gave us a semi final place against Tecumseh A, which we were unlucky to lose 2-1. Then, despite another good performance, we went down 2-0 to Camp Lawrence in the consolation game. Our only other game was at home against West End, where two defensive mixups gave them a 2-0 lead. And, despite hitting the post and dominating the last 15 minutes, we failed to score the goal we deserved.

Boys 12 & Under - In the only game for this age group, a potentially very strong Robin Hood side let themselves down by losing 4-0. The second half performance was much better but by this time, the damage was done.

Boys 13 & Under - In our own tournament, we won our first two group games against West End (2-1) and Wigwam (2-0), thanks to two goals each from Nicolo Villa and Elbio Bonsaglio. Our next game ended 2-2 against Birchmont, who came back strongly in the second half after 2 more Nicolo goals which had given us the lead. We were scheduled to play Maine Teen next but they were eliminated for fielding overage players. This left us at the top of our group with a semi final against Winaukee, where a poor first half performance gave them a 1-0 lead. A much more committed Robin Hood performance in the second half was halted in the final minutes as Winaukee scored a 2nd. Two days later, at Winaukee, we went one step further to finish runners up. This was achieved thanks to a 4-0 victory over Winaukee Silver, including Nicolo scoring direct from a corner. Another amazing goal by Nicolo was the difference between us and Kenwood. We then defeated Winaukee Silver 5-1 in the semifinal, before losing to Winaukee gold in a scrappy final. Throughout both tournaments, the Italian trio of Nicolo, Alain and Elbio were a pleasure to watch, and they were matched by the determination and commitment of Emre Kennedy, Rob Cayne and Dan Weinstein.

Boys 15 & Under - At Winaukee, we began well by beating Cody 2-0, thanks to goals from Tyler Head and Matt Killian. Our second game was tougher but the creativity of Nicolo set up goals for Tyler and the hard working Matt Killian, while Jeff Baumgardner was outstanding in defense. With our semi-final place assured, we conceded two early goals to lose to Tecumseh. Our semi-final began poorly, with us going 2-0 down to Winaukee. In the second half, a well worked goal put us back in the game, and as we threatened to equalize, a deflected goal gave Winaukee the victory. We picked ourselves up to claim third place by beating Kenwood. This game, like all the others, was a great team performance. It is also unforgettable for the penalty which Nicolo converted to make it 3-1 (sorry, Jeff!).

Boys 16 & Under - As part of a Play Day against Samoset, we beat them 2-0 in a game that I will never forget as Andy Pascal scored our second goal from well inside his own half (60-70 yards!).

By the end of the season, 45,000 rounds had been fired with over 6,000 targets being submitted for scoring. Where 64 boys earned 162 awards and 32 girls earned 81 awards from Pro-Marksman through Expert 1, developing 243 levels of awards with a PJ earning a prone Expert and Lancer earning a 50 ft. Expert and an Arrow and a Yeoman earning a four-position Expert 1.

Of 22 PJ-Squires, many came to riflery to learn new shooting skills and some to improve on past abilities where 15 earned 32 different levels of awards. The most improved shooters were Jake Schwarz earning MM1st through Bar 1 (prone) and Ben Jelin earning Bar 5 (kneeling). The high shooters of the group were also Jake and Ben, both shooting 47's. The highest level of shooting for the group was Ben Jelin who earned a Light Rifle Expert award in prone and who also was awarded the Best In Camp for Junior Camp boys.

17 Archers, also came to riflery learning new skills and some developing on more advanced levels with 15 earning 48 different levels of awards. Some of the most improved shooters were Ethan Lieberman and Duncan Mendelsohn both earning to Bar 7 (kneeling) and Juan Gough shooting a high score of 48 in prone. The highest level of awards went to Charlie Brondel who earned MM through Bar 4 (sitting) and who was awarded the Most Improved for Junior Camp boys.

19 Yeomen also came to riflery to learn and improve on older skills, where 9 earned 28 different levels of awards. Some of the most improved shooters were Jon Hillman earning PM through Bar 1 (prone) and Jonah Abrams earning Bar 5 through Bar 7 (kneeling). The high shooter of the group was Tom Hamilton with a 97 prone. Tom Hamilton also earned his fifth Expert rating in J.O.S.P., an Expert I, and was awarded the Best In Camp award for Senior Camp boys.

33 Lancers came to riflery with new and older campers to learn and develop newer skills, where 14 earned 28 different levels of awards. The most improved shooters were Jesse Brush earning Bar 6 (kneeling) and Aaron Samet earning a 50 ft. Expert. The high shooter of the group was Michael Kanon with a 196 and three 50's.

27 Friars also came to riflery to learn new basic skills and improve on older skill levels, where 11 earned 26 different levels of awards. The most improved was Chris Glibert earning PM through Bar 1 (prone) and both Lee Jacobson and Marc Siegel who earned Bar 8

(standing). The pair of top shooters were Chris Clark and Chris Glibert with 49's. The overall most improved shooter was Parker Wilson, earning PM through Bar 4 (sitting). Parker Wilson was also awarded the Most Improved in Senior Camp boys.

23 Foresters and 17 Saxons had some individuals who enjoyed a little shooting. For the Foresters, Jay Klein had a 42 in standing and Josh Weinstein had an 80 in prone. The high shooter for the group was Jarett Kaplus with a 96 in prone.

Starting with the girls camp for '97, 20 Jesters came to riflery and learned many new shooting and safety skills with a lot of fun, where 8 earned 19 different levels of awards. The Jesters then were followed by 26 Bows who also continued improving on new skills with 15 earning 34 awards. Combining these two groups, Madeline Kerner, Jill Mayer, Johanna Mayer and Tavor Sondheimer received The Most Improved for Junior Camp girls. Then, to finalize the highest levels for the Jesters and Bows and earning MM through



Bar 2 (sitting), Abby Bangser was awarded the Best In Camp for Junior Camp girls.

27 Arrows also came to riflery to learn new skills and enjoy shooting with 6 earning 6 awards. Rachel Farrer earned her second Expert rating, a J.O.S.P. Expert I with the top shooting scores of 97 in prone and 85 in standing, developing the highest abilities in shooting effort and skill. Rachel was awarded Overall/Best In Camp.

18 Bards came to riflery to also improve on newer and older skills with 8 earning 17 different levels of awards. To finish senior girl's camp, 10 Shires and 6 Scribes came to the rifle range to enjoy some free time shooting with 5 earning 5 awards. The highest awards earned were Shire Robyn Hoffman earning Bar 1 (prone) combined with Scribe Lindsay Hamburg earning Marksman.

The Forester group produced some of the most aggressive, competitive skiing from any group at camp this summer. That is largely

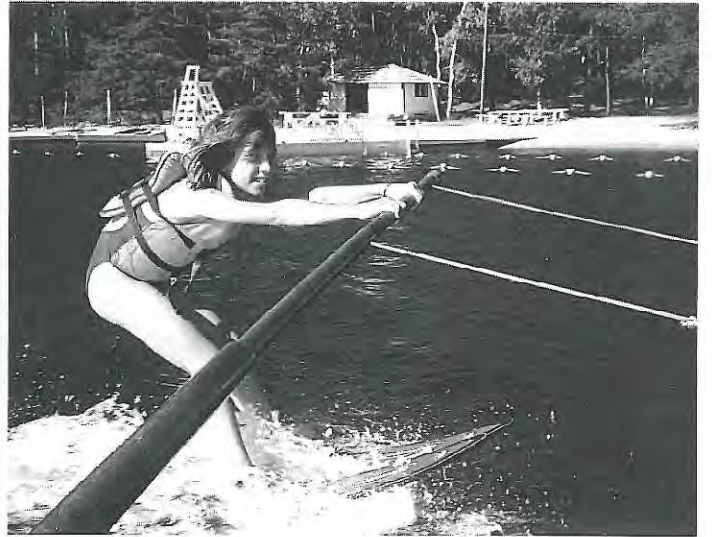
