But, the archery programme has not just been about the tournaments. 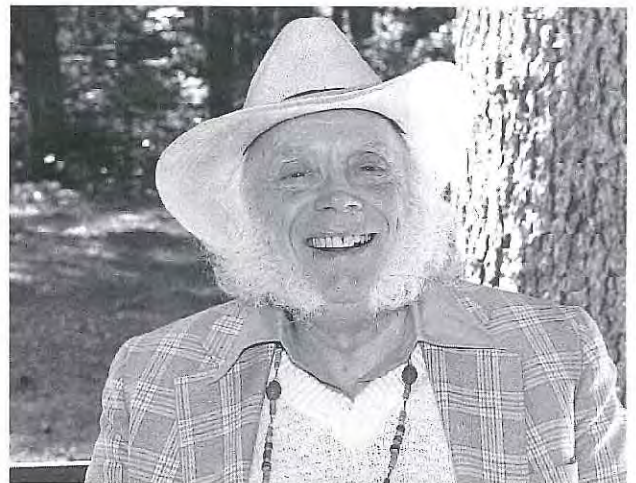
thought I would make so many friends, campers and staff, in just two short months. Robin Hood, the pleasure has certainly been all mine. Paul Rennie

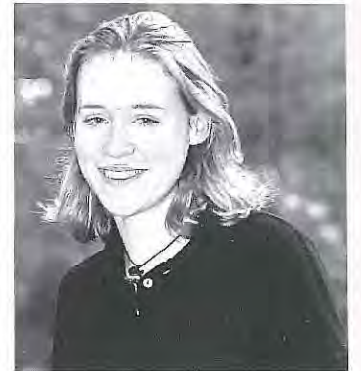

# WOODSHOP

In all my visits to the girls' camps at that time, I never saw any kind of woodshop, let alone a woodshop that is so well equipped as the one we have at Robin Hood. In fact, the woodshop at Robin Hood is as popular an activity for girls as it is for boys. I am told by the bunk counselors that when campers choose their next day's activities, they often have to discuss who will have their turn in woodworking. I was surprised at how popular the woodshop was with the girls when I first arrived at Robin Hood, and was extremely pleased.



The other thing that I wanted to point out is that woodworking used to be a standard activity in schools in the United States. The "technology" of yesterday has given way to the computer technology of today in most school districts. Camp Robin Hood is the only place that most campers get to experience the joy of creating projects out of wood. Working in the woodshop can have a practical benefit, as well. One Robin Hood camper used her talents that she learned in the woodshop to complete her project that was required to certify her studies in architecture. Others have reported using their woodshop skills to do things as simple as building shelves in their dorm rooms at college. But enough of these other things to do with woodworking. Let's look at some of the things that have been accomplished this past summer by the campers at Robin Hood.

After all this discussion, it is a pleasure to talk about the accomplishments of individual campers. Among the Lancers, Alex Wheeler decided to make a small, but well-constructed box. 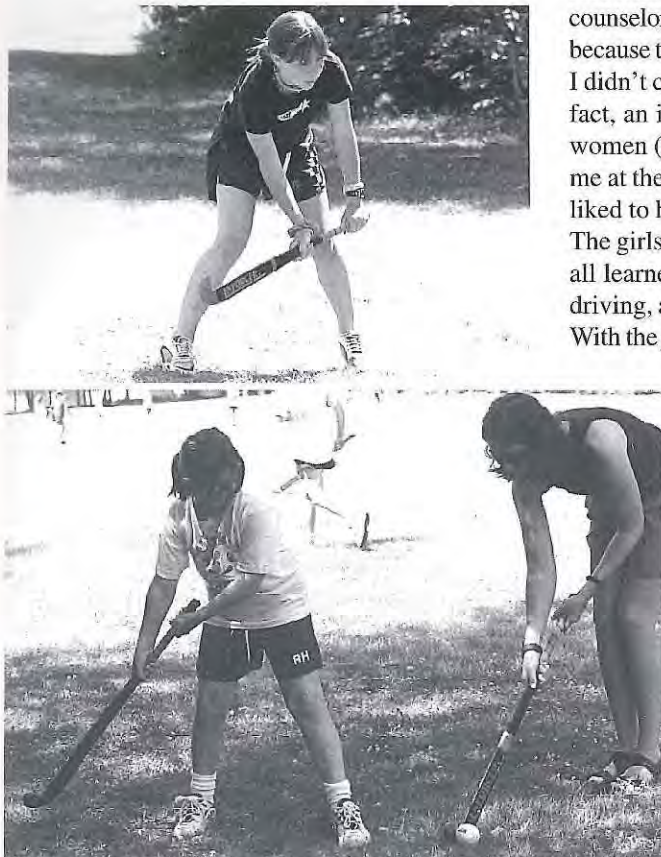

You surpassed our every expectation for you. You all were great! Thank you for making our first year running lacrosse a worthwhile learning experience.



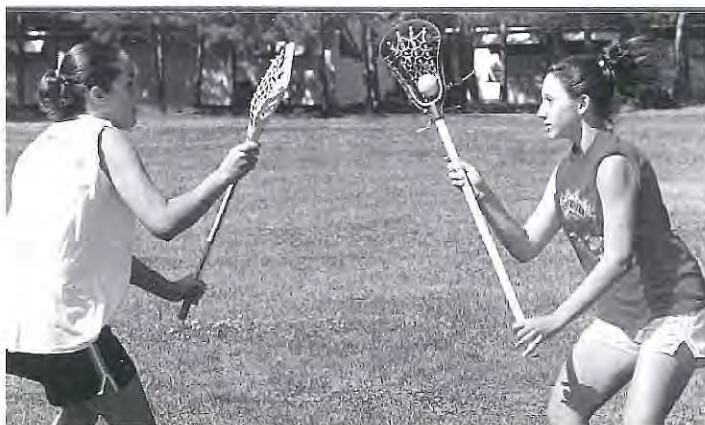

## BASEBALL/SOFTBALL

The Robin Hood baseball/softball program won three championships over the summer, but more importantly the kids got a chance to play a lot of ball.

In the semi-finals, Robin Hood faced a strong Winaukee team. The entire game was close as the lead went back-

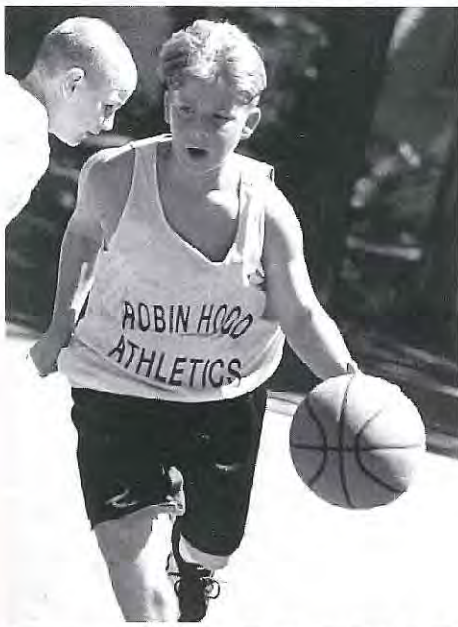
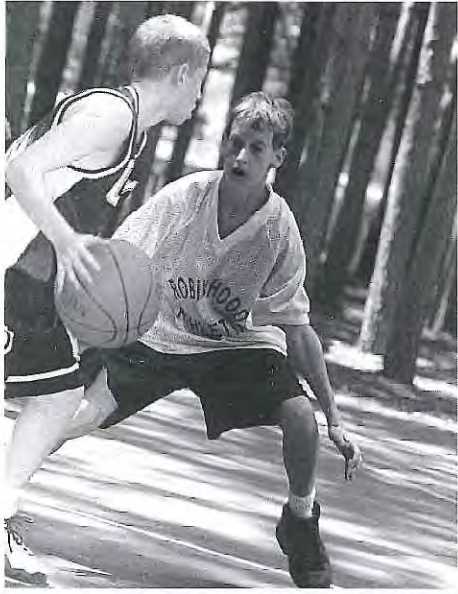

only tournament at Tecumseh. The boys clinched a 4th place position.

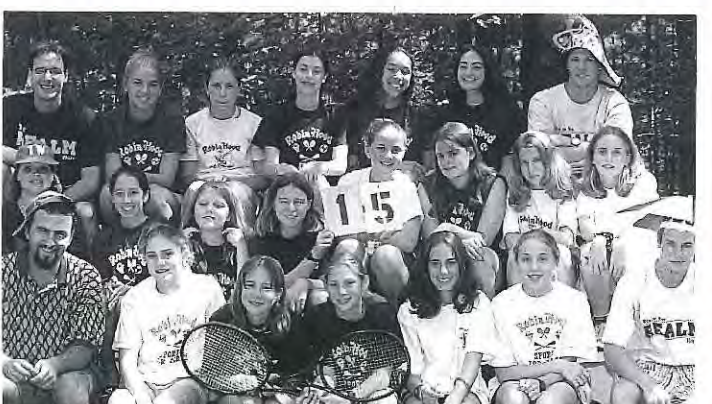

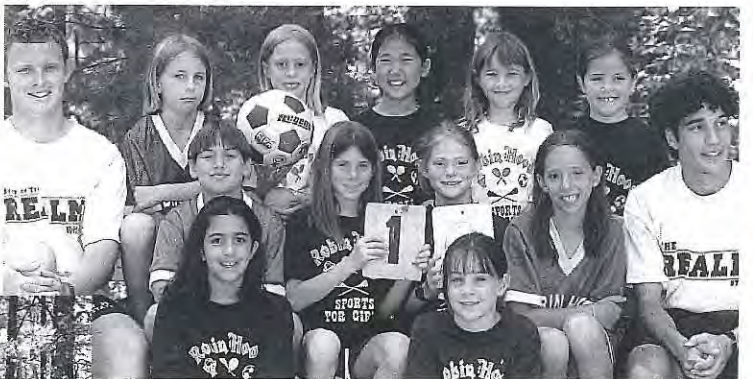

## PHOTOGRAPHY

Another fine summer of photography at the Realm! Dick and Liz enjoyed working with over 125 campers who improved their photographic skills and had fun doing it. Campers had the opportunity to expose, process and print black and white photographs during scheduled class periods, open rest periods and Green and White photo competition.

Several groups had 100% group participation. For the younger groups, this was a time for learning darkroom skills. Older campers, who attended more heavily during rest hours and evening times, often wanted to make pictures of special people, and Robin Hood is full of special people, as we all know.

The youngest campers are always full of energy, enthusiasm and wonder when it comes to learning something new like photography. They start by making creative photograms in the darkroom, then

expose film in a camera, process film, and print negatives. The most frequent attendees from the Tumblers were Dana Berschler, Michelle Brush, Erin Earley, Jenny Glazer, Sara Kushma, Audrey Lee, Lily Miesmer and Sarah Szewczyk. Others also participated. The campers and counselors who posed for their wonderful pictures also played a part, as they did in all groups.

The Jesters also produced outstanding work for young campers. Their favorite photo activities were making 5x7 enlargements of their best negatives and making photograms wishing family members "Happy Anniversary," "Happy Birthday" and "I Miss You." The following Jesters were the most active: Alison Chemla, Lauren Ehrlich, Samantha Glazer and Natalie Haimo. In fact, Alison Chemla was the most frequent darkroom participant in all Camp Robin Hood, with 18 practice sessions. Since practice makes perfect, she improved her photography skills so much that she won the Photography Award for Girls in Progress and Achievement (most improved).

The Bows and Quills exposed many rolls of film in camp cameras as well as in their own cameras. Before processing the film, they had to work in total darkness to get the film out of its cassette, onto a processing reel and into a processing tank. This procedure is not easy to do and many need help at one stage or another during the loading steps. Two campers were able to do it without help. They were Bow Jackie Frumkin and Quill Addaia Arizmendi. Other frequent attendees were Bow Libby Copeland-Halperin, and Quill Laura Berger, Ashley Jahneke, and Dara Rice.





The Arrows and Bards who attended showed excellent skill in selecting the best negatives from their exposed film. Once the negative was in the enlarger, they framed and focused the desired image, and sometimes tried more sophisticated techniques such as dodging and burning in. After eight minutes of "expose," "develop," "stop," "fix" and "wash," they made a test print. They showed discretion in evaluating the test print, which resulted in their ability to get good quality prints from their selected negatives. The campers who practiced these skills most frequently were Arrows Kristina Futterman, Leslie Lee and Sarah Stein-Sapir and Bards Natasha Berney and Kim Frumkin.

As usual, the Shires were heavy users of the darkroom. Being older and having more experience at Camp Robin Hood, especially in the photography darkroom, they came more frequently, were able to work more independently, and therefore produced more quality prints. They enjoyed making prints of individual campers, group shots and favorite staff members.

Frequent attendees were Anne Loughlin, Lisa Reitman, Julie Ritz, Alissa Rothchild, Karen Salomon and Mara Weinstein. However, the three most frequent visitors were Leticia Bendelac, Aurelie Leportz and Zoe Sprung, and they accomplished the record in just four weeks at camp. They almost always came as a group of three, working cooperatively and efficiently with each other. By working together, they shared their knowledge and skill in photography and each became a better darkroom technician. Because of their combined efforts, all three of them shared in the Photography Award for Girls in Effort and Skill - Best In Camp.

The PJ-Squires like to experiment with photography. Making photograms of inanimate objects and expired insects was their specialty. (Don't worry, Steve Rupp, we didn't use your refrigerator to store any insects this year.) Justin Tansey made a very good photogram enlargement of a dead spider, showing its hairy body and legs. Each year, someone decides to make a ghost picture - this year it was PJ-Squire Nate Hill. So, a group of us worked together with Nate as the ghost and took a double exposure of him covered with a sheet and positioned in the darkroom. This setup created a very effective "ghost in the darkroom" photo.

As was mentioned earlier, it is very difficult for young people to master the technique of loading exposed film onto a processing reel in the total darkness. Generally, we have to help junior campers (and sometimes senior campers and counselors) with one or more steps in the procedure. However, one junior camper was able to do it independently without any help from us. His name is Daniel Ebin. He didn't do it just once, but several times. He also went through all the processing steps for his films and printing steps for his enlargements by himself. For his fine performance, he received the Photography Award for Boys for Progress and Achievement - Most Improved. Other PJ-Squires who were frequent attendees were Zach Frumkin, Billy Gough, Jonathan Katz, Teddy Newmyer, Brad Shane and Joel Salomon.

The Archers showed a lot of interest in our collection of old cameras with antiquated flashbulb systems. They exposed fresh film, processed old and new film, and made many photographs, including 5x7 and 8x10 enlargements. Josh Greenberger, Eli Larkins and Kevin Margolius all processed their exposed film from 1997 and got very good results. (Black and white film is usually good for 10 to

20 years, and some films may last from 30 to 50 years. Program Director Dave Freedman found an old film in a desk in the office. We push processed it and used high-contrast filters to make the prints. The resulting photos indicated that the film was about 30 years old.) Other active Archers were Matthew Brody, Ben Jelin, Ross Lee and Jeremy Schwartz.

Senior boys were good participants during the Green & White competition. Several Yeomen were heavily involved: Andrew Arnot, Justin Dobry, Scott Heller and Fahed Sultan. Fahed did very well for a first-time darkroom technician. He made three very creative photograms which were all selected to be entered into the competition. David Benzaquen of the Friars helped his Green & White team in photography, and Friars Thibault Chauchat and Michael Kanon did some good work in class. The most active senior camper was Saxon Robyn Heller. He came to several class programs and constructed a pinhole camera. During many rest hours, he was in the darkroom processing and printing. During the Green & White

competition, Robyn was in charge of the Green photographic team. He exposed, processed and printed several rolls of film for his team. He exhibited very good photographic knowledge and skill, so he was able to work independently and produce very fine results. Because of his photographic accomplishments, he received the Photography Award for Boys for Effort and Skill - Best In Camp.

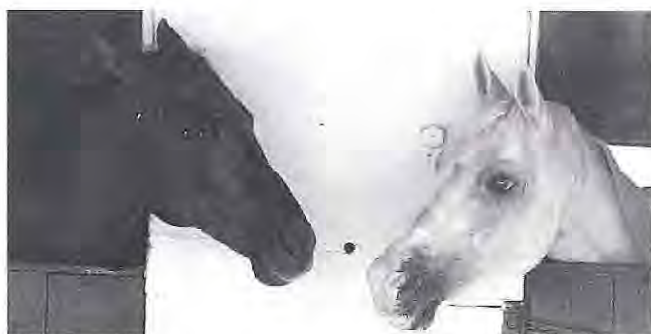
Congratulations to all the campers who did such good work this year. Liz and I enjoyed our darkroom time with you. Teaching you was fun for us. We hope to see you next summer.

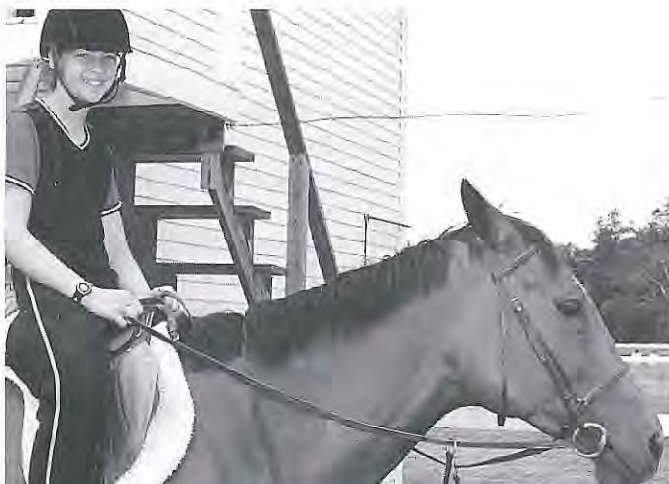

Expert II.

Both of these boys were also awarded the Most Improved for Senior Camp boys.

28 Lancers came to the rifle range with new and older campers to learn and develop newer skills, where 12 earned 29 different levels of awards. The most improved shooters were Jonah Abrams earning Bar 8 & 9 (standing) and Geoffrey Cox earning Bar 9 (standing). The high shooter of the group was Tom Hamilton with a 50 in (prone) and an 89 (standing) and also earning his sixth Expert, a Junior Olympic Expert II. He then was awarded the Best In Camp for Senior Camp boys.

26 Friars learned new basic skills and improved on older skill levels where 10 earned 29 different levels of awards. The most improved were Thibault Chauchat and Benjamin Potts, both earning PM through Bar 1 (prone). The top shooter was Alain Cianchini earning Bar 1 through Expert and having a high score of 94 (prone) and who was also awarded the Best in Camp for Senior Camp boys.
