15 & Under Girls – We were very enthusiastic about this team not only because of the apparent skills but also due to the creation of the Robin

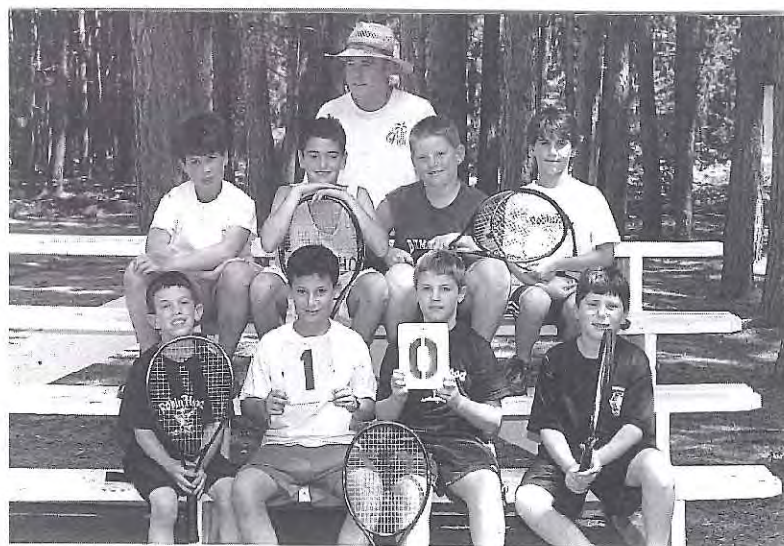
