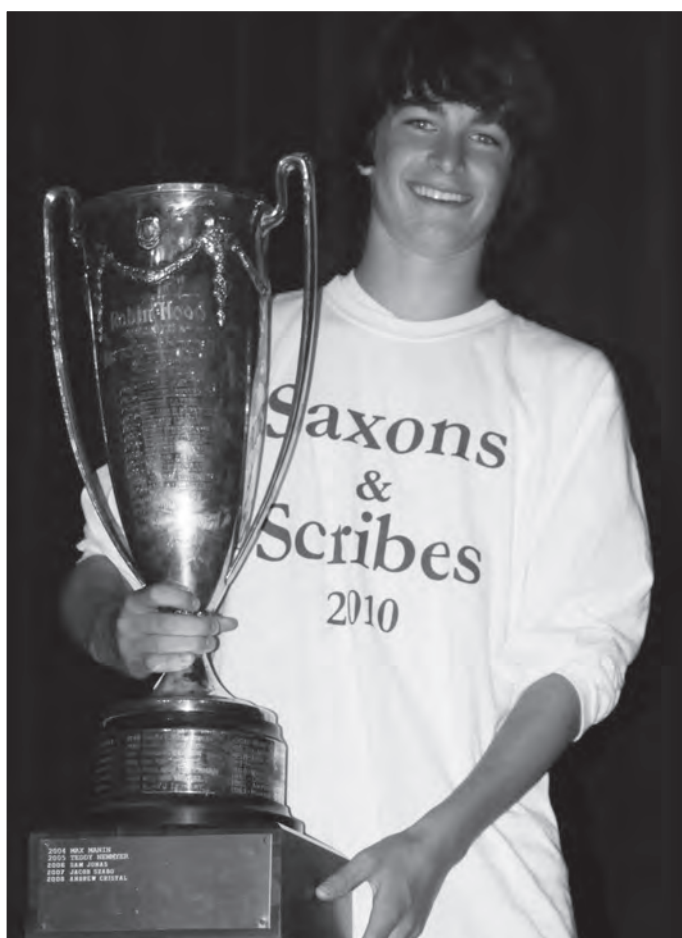

B-boyz, B-boyz DO YOUR THING...

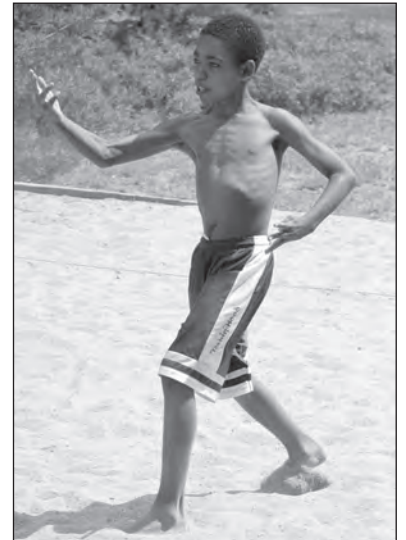

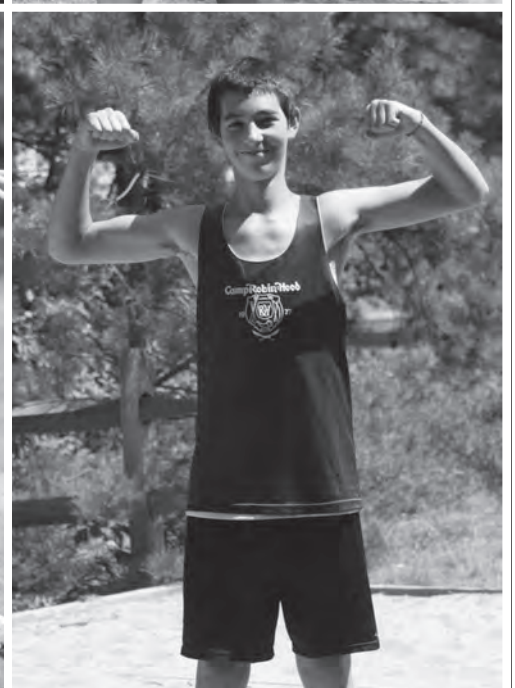
us...Atok gets de-cleated at homeplate and is taken to the hospital...Professor Gordon texts Jonas that Atok is on life support.
