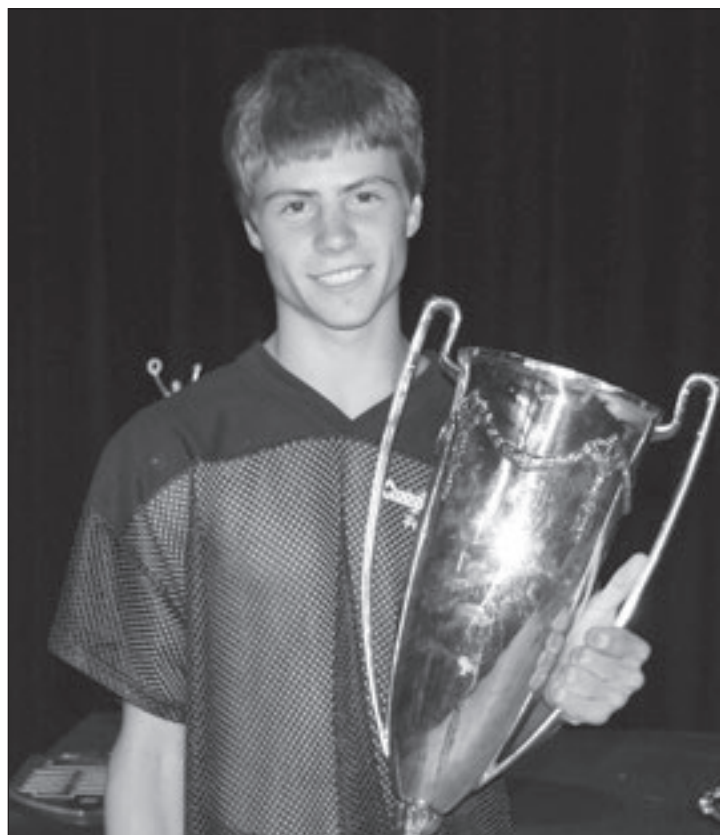

SQUIRES

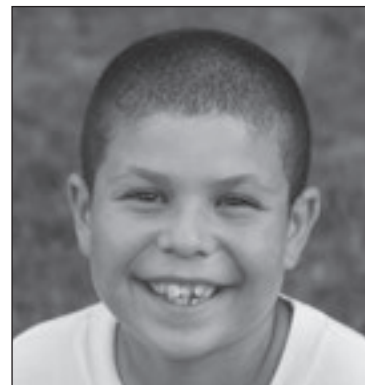
